The location is about 10 minutes North of the library where we have recently been meeting, just over the bridge a few miles in Stafford. It's on the same road with Stafford High School.

Advantages are that the space is large and configurable with many tables and chairs. We have access to an industrial kitchen with multiple ovens, stovetops, refrigerator and freezer.

Which is really handy, because this party is POTLUCK! Bring your favorites – there is no sign-up or coordination.

Show off your best savory and sweet treats! We are able to pop things in the oven to warm during the first part of the meeting if that's helpful.

Please mark if your dish is Gluten Free, or has nuts, etc. for folks who are sensitive.

Also don't forget to bring your presents for the (optional) Gift Exchange. We upped the top-limit on "monetary value" to \$25 this year, as it's very hard to get much for \$15 any more. But keep in mind that's a top limit – you do NOT have to spend that much! Bring your gift wrapped and we will draw numbers to pick gifts. 



Book Review - by Kara Pekar

Andrea Rangel's *KnitOvation Stitch Dictionary* is exactly what the subtitle claims: 150+ modern colorwork knitting motifs. In other words, stitch patterns for repeating motifs worked in two colors. Featuring visually interesting designs and clear, easy-to-follow charts, this book is a welcome addition to any collection of stitch pattern books.

The book begins with a section discussing the impact of yarn choice on the finished piece. Photographs of swatches worked in the same pattern but in different types of yarn demonstrate how a variety of factors influence the look of the final product.

The stitch patterns make up the bulk of the book. Each is shown with both a chart and a photo of the knitted swatch. There is a wide variety of motifs, including flora, fauna, curved and rectilinear patterns, and miscellaneous common items. You'll find everything from dragons to rubber ducks, maple leaves to abstract waves. Many motifs are beautiful or visually interesting; some are clever, even amusing. The book's only real weakness is that the motifs are mixed somewhat randomly, rather than organized into logical groupings. To find one, you have to either browse the entire selection, or look up the motif by name in the index.

Ms. Rangel also includes three patterns to demonstrate how one can apply the motifs to three-dimensional clothing items: a hat, a sweater, and a pair of mitts. The pullover sweater pattern uses two motifs in the yoke. It's graded for 13 sizes, ranging from a chest circumference of 33" all the way up to 69", so it's very size-inclusive.

Following the motifs, Ms. Rangel includes a list of abbreviations used in the patterns, and a glossary of techniques accompanied by illustrations. Finally, there are four separate indexes: a stitch count index, a row count index, a pattern-name index, and a subject index; the latter covers topics found in the book, but not the subjects or categories of motifs.

This is a terrific collection of repeatable motifs for knitting or designing knitwear, and has definitely earned a place among my knitting books. I love the look of so many of the motifs, and I know I will turn to the book over and over for my own knitting.

* We have also been given the green light to replace the gasket on the guild's drum carder, so that we can use that to experiment and demonstrate fiber prep. We may eventually hold a fiber prep class, maybe next spring or summer.

* Speaking of fiber, Fran Slaterbeck has graciously loaned us her tall plastic clothes basket to use for storage of fibers for class - thank you Fran! I'll donate the old baby tub to Goodwill and we'll tape the labels onto it so folks know why it's in the corner. Speaking of fiber, if anyone is doing fall cleaning and has decided they really aren't going to use some of their fiber stash, we are accepting donations.

Rigid Heddle Weaving Classes:

Notes from Georgette about her classes: The fifth student is weaving her way to the end make of her scarf and should be done by December 9th. So far 3 out of the five students have bought themselves a loom to pursue the craft further, I think 4 have joined the guild. Please welcome Elizabeth, April, Ruthy and Roxanne to the world of weaving! There are two more students signed up for January - the teacher is taking December off.

Opportunities from Georgette: Any guild member who does not know how to weave but would like to learn, you are more than welcome! I would be more than happy to give you complimentary beginners lesson. The lessons would be at the Studio on either a floor loom or a table loom. There are 4 lessons that usually last 1-2 hours, and for some of that you would be on your own after you learn how to actually weave.
